Engineering: At the Celebration and Assessment Day run by the Engineering Development Trust, RGS Go4SET Team 1 won the Best Overall Project category for their high level of research and testing, while RGS Go4SET Team 2 was awarded the pupils' choice category for Best Display Stand.

Music: The annual Concerto Concert took place in Holy Trinity Church with eight of our most talented musicians performing solos, accompanied by Guildford's resident professional orchestra, *Southern Pro Musica*. In a programme which included some gems such as the Mendelssohn Violin Concerto, it was also fascinating to hear some less well-known works such as Guilmant's splendid Organ Symphony. Sixth Form students **Jonathan Chong**, **Nicholas Edwards**, **Roshan Patel**, **Yousuf Mirza**, **Matthew Sargent**, **Alexander Acomb**, **Joshua Powell** and **Ciaran O'Toole** all performed with astonishing maturity and sensitivity, and the audience was left to reflect on an evening of quite exquisite musicianship.

Quiz: The Junior Schools Challenge quiz team suffered a narrow defeat at Hampton School in the Regional Final, losing 670 – 620. The team ably led by **Ferdy Al-Qassab** (2R) acquitted themselves well and were unfortunate to come up against such strong opposition.

Young Enterprise: At the Surrey County Finals, Lunar was awarded *Best Company Report*. Then, as the climax of the evening, EduNow was announced as *Runner-up Company* in Surrey, while Lunar went one better to emerge as *Best Company* in Surrey. With only two Surrey teams progressing to the South East finals, it is to the great credit of the RGS students that those two teams are RGS Young Enterprise companies.

Athletics: At the District Sports at Guildford Spectrum, the Under 13s came first, the Under 15, 14 and 12 teams all finished in a close second position. A number of Personal Bests were achieved.

Cricket: In the annual fixture, the 1st XI secured a phenomenal victory against the MCC. On a very slow pitch and outfield, the RGS bowled MCC out for 125. In reply, RGS just managed to get across the winning line with one wicket to spare. In the block fixture against King's College School, Wimbledon, the RGS teams emerged with seven victories from the eight fixtures. Individual highlights included for the 1st XI **Abhay Gonella** (U6) with 119* and **Benji Thomas** (U6) with 97*, and **Yusuf Hafiz** (U6) with bowling figures of 5 – 27. For the 2nd XI Joshua Powell took three wickets and finished on 61*. In the Under 14s, **Matthew Sutton** (3T) and **George Williams** (3E) both took three wickets at the expense of ten and twelve runs respectively. The junior teams also enjoyed a successful weekend with four out of five wins against King Edward's School, Southampton. The bowlers were of particular note with **Mohammed Hussain** (2L) 3 – 3, **Nirek Dandanayak** (1C) 5 – 6, and **Thomas Dowdeswell** (1C) an astonishing hat-trick with figures of 3 – 1.

Fencing: At the British Youth Fencing Championships in Sheffield, **Leo Kamstra** (3E), **Kit** (L6) and **Freddie** (3S) **Edgecliffe-Johnson** were representing the South-East and Southern Regions in the British Youth Fencing Championships. All the boys acquitted themselves admirably; however, of particular note, in the Under 14 Épée, Leo secured the bronze medal and is currently second in the England Ranking.

Karate: Ilhan Mosobbir (L6) won silver in the CIMAC Superleague British Karate Open in High Wycombe.

Shooting: At the Surrey Rifle Association Schools' Meeting, our shooting team excelled picking up three trophies. **Alfie Hellings** (U6) won the trophy for *Best Marksman*; our VIII won trophies for being both *Best Surrey School* and *Best School* overall. **Luca O'Flynn** (L6) scored a maximum 35 at 300yds. This was followed up by further success at the LMRA Schools' Meeting where first places were secured in the Cadet IV and Ashburton VIII competitions. This is the first time in memory that the RGS has won three full-bore competitions in one season: an incredible achievement.

Swimming: Max Windle (3L) has qualifyied for six events at the Cardiff International Open Meet where he will compete alongside European and Olympic champions in a bid to qualify for the Nationals.
